Supporting the **48208 Collaborative** with their meetings and taking part in their work to revitalize 48208.

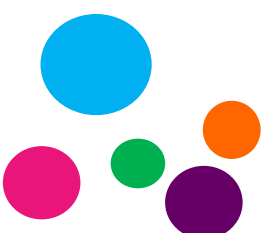
