Join us for our monthly **Safety Committee** meetings every 2nd Wednesday of the month at 5:30pm at our office, where we have topics on how to reduce blight and crime in our neighborhood. Over 75 residents were involved in 2019. Our safety committee continues to increase in resident membership while involving residents in safety initiatives like the Hope Patrol (neighborhood patrol), hot spot reporting (anonymous safety reporting), neighborhood cleanups (Motor City Makeover, etc.) and conducting monthly safety briefings which included professionals from DPD, Ceasefire, and DDOT.

Special thanks to Beatrice Rodriguez our Safety Committee chair.

We continued our successful partnership with the Metropolitan Diaper Bank as a diaper distribution point where our volunteers issue diapers monthly to over 60 neighborhood families in need.



We joined residents and community partners in the development of our Chadsey Condon 5-year Neighborhood Development Plan.



We partnered with the Bridging Neighborhoods Organization in showing potential resident prospects the positive elements of our community (neighborhood tours).

The Chadsey Condon Youth **Committee** has monthly youth nights on the 3rd Thursday of the month, at 5:00pm, at our office. Our youth committee continued to increase in youth membership while preparing neighborhood youth for, high school, college, leadership, with college tours (U of M, etc.), monthly youth night activities, and workshops facilitated by subject matter experts (FAFSA application preparation, etc.). Over 42 youth were involved in 2019. We were honored to assist several youths in completing job application requirements for the Grow Detroit's Young Talent Summer Job program which were successfully awarded summer jobs. We are proud to have partnered with Hope Starts
Here and Congress of
Communities in soliciting and utilizing resident input in order to design and build child friendly prototype spaces in 3 neighborhood locations as a blueprint for future use in daycares, doctor's offices, nursery's etc.



We participated in **Motor City Makeover** in May of 2019. We
removed over 56 trash bags
and bulk items. We also
participated in various clean
up and board up events
throughout the year.



We are very proud to have provided office space for residents to receive nutritional food preparation classes from one of our volunteer board members.



Teaming up with the Warren/Junction Community Council, our Neighborhood Inclusion Committee successfully mobilized our residents in campaigning against rezoning areas of our neighborhood into an industrial zone until appropriate environmental and traffic studies be completed and results shared with residents.




